EDI offers FREE expert data management support to:

EDI enhances data management skills throughout the community by:

- In-person and online training
- Interactive webinars
- A <u>fellowship program</u> in which students complete an 8week information management project at a sponsoring lab or research site

EDI produces information management tools to help scientists create high quality data and metadata:

- ezEML, a user-friendly web-based editor to generate EML
- EMLAssemblyLine, an R package to generate EML
- taxonomyCleanr, an R package to link taxa with IDs from a taxonomic authority


