# Why develop a public Environmental Enforcement Watch now?

- Violations of federal environmental laws are chronic and routine.
- Enforcement declined under the Trump Administration.
- During the COVID-19 crisis Trump put enforcement effectively on hold
- What's next for the Biden administration?

# Enforcement and Compliance History Online

- Visible through existing interface: last 3-5 yrs.
- Not visible, only available through downloads: records going further back.
- Contents organized based on how EPA itself works
- ☐ Not very accessible to a general audience

## **Environmental Enforcement Watch**

### A project including workshops to:

- Inform members of the public about industry-related pollution meaningful to them and their networks.
- Provide a **space** for people to **share their stories** and build connections with others concerned about the decline of federal environmental enforcement.
- ☐ Create compelling and informative **visualizations**
- Analyze data to answer questions posed by communities and researchers.



To address these goals, we are organizing different connected tracks based on participants' own skills and interests.

## Jupyter Notebook - How it works

- 1. Run through Google Colaboratory links
- 2. The notebook is comprised of text and code cells that are run by clicking "play" •
- 3. Users can make selections from dropdown lists, to customize their analysis. State: NY
- 4. Now let's see what one of these notebook runs looks like....

- ☐ Identify operators in a location who are in non-compliance with their permits
- ☐ Build **company report cards**
- ☐ Analyze greenhouse gas emissions by company and location
- Analyze compliance and enforcement by Congressional district
- Create widespread awareness of the gaps in environmental enforcement
- ☐ Demonstrate active public interest in industrial accountability
- Demonstrate that the public can support regulators and agencies to **protect public and environmental health**

Oversee 3 major programs\* monitoring polluters based on...



#### Air

Clean Air Act (CAA; 1970, amended 1990)



### Water

Clean Water Act (CWA; 1972)



### **Hazardous Waste**

Resource Recovery and Conservation Act (RCRA; 1976)



<sup>\*</sup>Other programs include Superfund, Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program (GHGRP), public drinking water systems, pesticides and other toxics.





#### **Permits**

Standards set for every potential/actual polluting facility



#### Inspections

When federal or state officials visit to check compliance



#### **Violations**

When a facility exceeds a permitted standard, falling out of compliance

- CAA & RCRA generally found on inspection
- CWA (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System NPDES): reported automatically
  - 4 kinds: "effluent", "single-event", "compliance schedule" or "permit schedule"



#### **Enforcement Cases**

When officials move toward informal or more formal action against a facility that is in violation, i.e., non-compliant
